When the privileges of the said company shall revert to this commonwealth.

SECT. 111. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That if the company to be incorporated by the original act shall\_ not proceed to carry on the said works in three years after the first day of May next, and shall not within seven years thereafter, complete the same according to the true intent and meaning of said original act, then in either of these cases, all and singular the rights, liberties and franchises granted to the said company by the act to which this is a supplement, shall revert to this commonwealth, and the proviso in the third section of the said act is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER CLXXXVIII.

An ACT to authorize Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman to sell a tract of land therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it is represented to the legislature that a tract of land situate in Penn township, in the county of Union, containing one hundred acres and seven perches was granted by patent dated the twentieth of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, to Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman in trust for the United Congregation of German Lutheran and Calvinists worshipping at Hessler's church in said township, that the said tract is wholly unproductive; that the congregation for want of funds are unable to complete their church and school-house; therefore,

Abraham Broose and Jacob Harman authorized to sell certain estate.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman trustees of the United Congregation of German Lutheran and Calvinists worshipping at Hessler's church in Penn township, in the county of Union, be and they are hereby authorized to sell the whole or such part as they may deem expedient of a tract of land situate in the said township, containing one hundred acres and seven perches and allowance, &c. adjoining lands of Simon Espy, Michael Hessler, Martin Michael and John Reem, grant-Application of ed to the said Abraham Brouse and Jacob Harman in trust for the said congregation by patent dated the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, and to apply the proceeds to finish their church and school house.

## CHAPTER CLXXXIX.

An ACT for the regulation of the militia of this commonwealth.

## MILITARY DIVISIONS.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the senate and house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the territory of this commonwealth shall be, and it is hereby divided into sixteen military the state dividivisions; each division to comprehend two brigades, and each bridging sixteen gade to comprehend as many regiments as can be organized within sions. the bounds thereof, according to the principles hereinafter prescribed. The divisions and brigades shall be numbered and organized as nearly as may be as follows:
