

SECT. X. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That this act shall be and continue in force for twenty years from the passing thereof, and no longer, for the purpose of manufacturing as aforesaid; but for the liquidation and settlement of all the transactions and accounts of the said company, the corporate powers thereof shall be and continue effectual, to all intents and purposes, as specified in this act, until the whole shall have been fully liquidated and settled: *Provided, always,* That if the said corporation shall at any time hereafter abuse any of the chartered privileges hereby granted, the legislature may, at any time thereafter, resume all and singular the rights, privileges, liberties and franchises hereby granted to said company.

CHAPTER XV.

*A further SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act to erect the town of Canonsburg, in the county of Washington, into a borough."*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate, and House of Representatives, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the last day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, the limits of the borough of Canonsburg, shall be as follow, viz. Beginning at William Hartupée's corner, thence south seventy-five degrees, west eighty-six perches, to a post near the mill race; thence along the ends of the lots west of Market street, north twenty-three degrees, west one hundred and forty-one perches, to the corner of Nathan Andrews's lot; thence along said lot, north seventy-five degrees, east forty-two perches, to Mount Pleasant road; thence along said road, south forty degrees, east twelve perches; thence along the ends of the town lots north of Pitt street, north seventy-five degrees, east sixty perches, to the corner of James Bellentine's lot; thence along said lot, south fifteen degrees, east sixteen perches, to the old Pittsburgh road; thence along said road, south seventy-five degrees, west five perches, to William Donaldson's lot; thence along the ends of the town lots

east of Green street, south fifteen degrees, east one hundred and eighteen perches, to the place of beginning.

CHAPTER XVI.

*An ACT to establish a Twelfth Judicial District.*

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the first Monday of July next, the counties of Schuylkill, Lebanon and Dauphin shall be, and the same are hereby erected into a separate judicial district, to be called the Twelfth District; and a person of legal knowledge and integrity shall be appointed and commissioned by the governor, to be president and judge of the courts of Common Pleas within the said district; which said president shall, after the first Monday of July next, receive the like salary, and have and execute all and singular the powers, jurisdictions and authorities of president and judge of the court of Common Pleas, court of Oyer and Terminer and General Jail Delivery, Orphans' court, and justice of the court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, agreeably to the constitution and laws of the commonwealth.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That* from and after the first Monday in July next, the courts of Quarter Sessions and Common Pleas, in the said twelfth judicial district, shall commence and be holden on the following days in each and every year, *to wit:* In the county of Schuylkill, on the last Mondays of March, July, October and December; in the county of Lebanon, on the first Monday after the commencement of the courts in Schuylkill county, and in the county of Dauphin, on the several days which have already been prescribed by law for holding the same; any law or laws to the contrary notwithstanding.

Extra sittings of common pleas of Lancaster county.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That* it shall be the duty of the court of Common Pleas for the county of Lancaster, to sit, for the dispatch of business, at least sixteen weeks in each and every year, by adjournment, at such
