CHAPTER XX.

An ACT to erect the town of Stroudsburg, in Northampton country, into a borough.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, the town of Stroudsburg, Stroudsburg in Northampton county, including the lots and lands attached to erected into said town, and belonging thereunto, shall be, and the same is a borough. hereby erected into a borough, which shall be called "The Bo-rough of Stroudsburg; bounded and limited as follows, viz. Beginning at the junction of Sambo creek with Broadhead's creek, thence down the east margin of Broadhead's creek, to its junc-Its bounda-tion with M'Michaels' creek; thence up said M'Michaels' creek, ries. along the south side thereof, to its junction with Pokono creek; thence up said Pokono creek, along the west side thereof, to its junction with Big Meadow run; and from thence to the place of beginning. And it shall and may be lawful for the persons residing within the borough of Stroudsburg, to exercise and enjoy similar rights To enjoy siand privileges, and at the same times, and under similar rules and milar priviregulations, and subject to the same fines and forfeitures, and shall leges with and may elect and appoint similar borough officers, which said the citizens borough officers and inhabitants, shall exercise similar and equal of the bopowers and authorities, and be in all things governed by similar Mercer. rules and regulations, as are granted to and provided for the inhabitants and borough officers of the borough of Mercer, in the county of Mercer, by an act of assembly, passed the twenty-eighth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, entitled "An act to erect the town of Mercer, in the county of Mercer, into a borough:" Provided, That the election for officers of the said borough, shall be holden at the academy in the same, and that the duties directed to be performed by the constable of Mercer township, in the law to which this refers, shall be performed by the constable of Lower Smithfield township for

CHAPTER XXI.

CHAPTER XXII.

An ACT to enable the Governor to appoint a notary public in Germantown.
