BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

tives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said Hardman Philips be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to receive a deed or deeds of conveyance, in fee simple, from Sophia Philips, of the city of Philadelphia, for any lands receive deed, held by her by virtue of any conveyances from John Philips, John Leigh Philips and Francis Philips, or either of them, in trust for the said Hardman Philips, or otherwise, and to grant the same, agreeably to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement.

CHAPTER XXII.

An ACT to enable the Governor to appoint a notary public in Germantown.

SECT. 1.
