CHAPTER XXIX.

An ACT granting additional emoluments to seamen employed in the defence of this commonwealth.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That there shall be paid to the petty officers, seamen, ordinary seamen and boys, who shall enter on board the flotilla of the United States, now in the bay of Delaware, and agree to serve therein during the term of one year, the following sums, to wit: To every petty officer and seaman twenty-five dollars, to every ordinary seaman twenty dollars, to every landsman or boy fifteen dollars, at the time of their entering the service: *Provided*, That the number of petty officers and seamen to whom such bounty shall be given shall not exceed two hundred, and that the number of such ordinary seamen shall not exceed two hundred and fifty, and that the number of such landsmen and boys shall not exceed one hundred and fifty. §25 to petty officers and seamen.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to appoint a paymaster, who shall attend at such places as may be convenient and proper, and pay the sums appropriated by this act, and shall receive from the commanding officer of the said flotilla, duplicate lists, certified by him, of all persons entitled to the benefit of this act, one of which he shall transmit to the auditor general; the said paymaster shall, before entering on the duties of his office, give bond for the use of the commonwealth, with sufficient sureties, to be approved by the governor, for the faithful performance of his duty; he shall receive, as a compensation for his services, two dollars per centum on the amount of monies actually paid by him, and shall Paymaster to be appointed.

settle his accounts with the accountant officers, in the manner prescribed by law for similar accounts.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of such paymaster, for the sums payable by virtue of this act, which shall be paid out of any monies in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

CHAPTER XXX.

An ACT to extend the boundaries of Northumberland county.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same;* That from and after the first day of May next, the townships of Turbit and Chillisquaque, in the county of Columbia, be, and the same are hereby annexed to and made part of Northumberland county: *Provided,* That all taxes or arrears of taxes laid, or which have become due within the townships aforesaid, before the passing of this act, and all sums of money due to this commonwealth for militia fines within said townships, shall be collected and received as if this act had not been passed: *And provided also,* That the sheriff, coroner and other officers of the county of Columbia, other than the justices of the peace, shall continue to exercise the duties of their respective offices within said townships, until the business appertaining to the duties of their offices respectively, and which shall have been commenced therein previous to the passing of this act, shall have been finally settled.

Townships of Turbit and Chillisquaque annexed to Northumberland county. Proviso as to taxes, militia fines, &c. Sheriffs, coroners, justices of the peace, &c.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That that part of the township of Turbit, whose inhabitants now elect at Washington, shall hereafter elect at Milton, and be attached to the eighth election district.
