

and by sufficient deed or deeds, to convey all the right, title, interest and estate of the said Mary, Thomas, Elizabeth and Matthew, into and out of one undivided third part of two certain tracts of land situate in Juniata (formerly Rye) township, in the county of Cumberland, and state of Pennsylvania, one containing two hundred and forty acres one hundred and seventeen perches, the other three hundred and forty-six acres one hundred and seven perches.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said Elizabeth Hale shall, before she proceed to sell any part of the said land, enter into recognizance with sufficient security, before the Orphans' Court of the city and county of Philadelphia, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined by this act, and faithfully to invest in some good and sufficient fund, bearing interest, and secured by mortgage on real estate, for the use of said minors or the survivor or survivors, the monies arising from the sale of said land, and to apply the interest accruing thereon to their education, maintenance and support, until they severally shall attain the age of twenty-one years, when they shall be entitled to receive their several shares of the principal.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

An ACT extending an act, entitled "An act securing to mechanics and others, payment for their labor and materials, in erecting any house or other building within the city and county of Philadelphia," to the borough of Marietta, in the county of Lancaster, and the borough of Harrisburg, in the county of Dauphin.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from the passage hereof, the act, entitled "An act securing to mechanics and others, payment for their labour and materials in erecting any house or other building within the city and county of Philadelphia," passed March the seventeenth, eighteen hundred and six, with its supplement, passed the twenty-eighth day of March, eighteen hundred and eight, shall be, and the same are hereby declared to be in full force and operation in the borough of Marietta, in the county of Lancaster, and the borough of Harrisburg in the county of Dauphin, and mechanics and others in the

said boroughs respectively, shall have like remedy under the said acts, as though they were herein enacted at full length.

CHAPTER XXXIX.

An ACT authorizing the Governor to incorporate the President, Managers and Company of the Smithfield turnpike road.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That ^{Commissioners named.} Thomas Armat, Daniel Stroud, Jacob Brown, James Burson, John Houser, Evan Thomas, Samuel Stokes, John Baker, Peter Kocher, John P. Arndt and Stephen Tuttle, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned, *that is to say,* They shall, on or before the first day of November next, procure two or more books, and in each of them enter as follows, viz. “We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Smithfield turnpike road, the sum of fifty dollars each, for every share of stock in said company set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers of said company, in pursuance of an act of the general assembly, entitled “An act authorizing the governor to incorporate the president, managers and company of the Smithfield turnpike road,” ^{Books to be opened.} and shall thereupon give public notice in one or more public papers printed in the county of Northampton, one month at least, of the times and places when and where the said books shall be kept open to receive subscriptions for stock of the said company, ^{Notice to be given.} at which times and places some one of the said commissioners shall attend, and shall permit all persons to subscribe in the said books, in their own names or the names of any other persons who shall duly authorize the same, for any number of shares in the said stock; and the said books shall be kept open respectively for the purpose aforesaid, at least six hours in every juridical day for three days, or until said books shall have four hundred shares subscribed, and if at the expiration of the said three days the books aforesaid shall not have the number of shares aforesaid therein subscribed, the said commissioners may adjourn from time to time, and transfer the said books elsewhere, until the whole number of shares shall be subscribed for, of which adjournment ^{Commissioners may adjourn and transfer} and transfer, the commissioners aforesaid may give such public books.
