CHAPTER XCII.

An ACT to compel the branch banks within this commonwealth, to receive, in payment, the notes of the banks of which they are severally branches.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That each branch bank within this commonwealth, shall receive, in payment, as well from other banks as from individuals, any note or notes of the original bank, of which it is a branch.

CHAPTER XCIII.

An ACT to authorize the guardian of Catharine Felty, to execute certain releases therein mentioned.

WHEREAS, it is represented, that the heirs of Jacob Ream, late of Dauphin county, deceased, viz. his brothers Abraham, Isaac and Daniel, his sisters Barbara, married to Jacob Palmer, Esther, married to John Parthemer, and Elizabeth, and the three children of his brother Samuel, deceased, viz. Samuel, Esther, and Catharine, married to John Felty, were tenants in common of a certain tract of land in said county, each party owning an undivided seventh part thereof, that by amicable agreement, they divided the said tract into seven lots, of which each party selected one, and lot number three was selected by the three children above named of Samuel Ream, as their part; that to complete the title, they mutually agreed to execute releases to each other for their respective lots; that Catharine, one of the three children of Samuel Ream, who was married to John Felty, died suddenly, leaving issue a minor daughter named Catharine, without having signed the release given by her husband, whilst all the other releases were duly executed according to agreement, in consequence of which the complete title to said lot number three, has been vested in the two surviving children of said Samuel Ream, and in Catharine Felty, the minor above mentioned, but the title of the owners of the other six lots is incomplete, from the want of releases from the said minor: Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is kereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

the guardian of Catharine Felty, a minor daughter of John Felty, is hereby authorized to release to Abraham Ream, Isaac Ream, Daniel Ream, Jacob Palmer and Barbara his wife, John Parthemer and Esther his wife, and Elizabeth Berringer, all the interest and claim of the said Catharine Felty, in and to lots numbered one, two, four, five, six, and seven, of a tract of land situate in Lower Paxton township, Dauphin county, bounded by lands of Jacob Berringer, the heirs of William Maclay, Henry Hare, and others, containing forty-seven acres and one hundred and thirty-three perches.

CHAPTER XCIV.

A SUPPLEMENT to an act, entitled "An act to erect the town of Chambersburg, in the county of Franklin, into a borough."

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the burgesses, town council, high constable, street and road com-Officers to missioners, who have been elected to serve the last preceding year exercise oriin the several offices to which they have been appointed, shall ginal powers continue to hold and exercise all the powers, and perform all the duties by them heretofore held, agreeably to the provisions of the act aforesaid, until the next succeeding annual terms of electing such officers, and no longer.

Sect. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,
That in case of death, resignation, refusal to accept, neglect or refusal to act after acceptance, of any of the said offices, the burgess, or in case of his absence or inability to act, or when he refuses or election in neglects to act, then any of the members of the town council case of vashall advertise and hold an election in manner as provided by the cancies. aforesaid act, to supply such vacancy, giving at least ten days notice thereof, by advertisements set up at four of the most public

places in said borough.

Sect. III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,
That it shall be the duty of the street and road commissioners, and Collection
they are hereby authorized and required to proceed to collect and and applicaapply all taxes which have been or may hereafter be assessed tion of taxes.
agreeably to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, in the same manner, and for the same purposes, as the supervisors, under the general road laws for improving the roads and
highways within the several counties of this commonwealth, is provided.
