CHAPTER CXV.

An ACT authorizing the court of quarter sessions, in Allegheny county, to regulate the ferries within the same.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be the duty of the court of quarter sessions, in and for the county of Allegheny, and they are hereby authorized to fix the rates or tolls of all ferries in the said county, and, as occasion may require, make such other rules and regulations, with respect to the said ferries, as to them may appear necessary and proper.

CHAPTER CXVI.

An ACT to anthorize the administrators of the estate, and the guardian of the minor children of Thomas Greer, deceased, to complete the title to certain lands therein mentioned.

WHEREAS, it hath been represented to the legislature, by the petition of Rebecca Greer, widow and administratrix of Thomas Greer, late of North-East township, in the county of Erie, deceased, and David Caldwell, administrator, as aforesaid, and John M'Cord, guardian of the minor children of the deceased; that the said Thomas Greer, deceased, did, in his life time, enter into sundry parole contracts, affecting his real estate, as follows, viz. to exchange one hundred acres of land, with a certain Arnold Custard, of the county aforesaid, and was to receive a deed from said Cus-

tard, in exchange therefor, for one hundred and fifty acres of laudin said county, which land was afterward sold by the said Thomas Greer aforesaid, to James Greer, and the said Thomas Greer also sold to John Greer, one hundred acres of land in the county aforesaid; and further, that the said Thomas Greer afterwards died intestate, without carrying the said contracts into effect: Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Rebecca Greer, administratrix of Thomas Greer, late of North-East Arnold Custownship, in the county of Erie, deceased, and David Caldwell, adtard to reministrator as aforesaid, and John M'Cord, guardian of the minor ceive a deed, children of the said Thomas Greer, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorized to execute a deed of conveyance to Arnold Custard, for one hundred acres of land lying in the county of Erie, bounded north on lake Eric, west on lands of William Baird, and on the south and east by lands of Thomas Greer, deceased: Provided, Proviso. That said Arnold Custard shall make and execute to James Greer, a deed for one hundred and fifty acres of land, lying in the county of Erie, bounded east by lands of Francis Brawly, south by lands of Thomas Melon, and on the west by lands of Abraham Custard.

Sect. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said Rebecca Greer, David Caldwell and John M'Cord, as aforesaid, are hereby authorized to execute a deed of conveyance to Deed to be John Greer, of the county of Erie, for one hundred acres of land in executed to North-East township, Erie county, bounded on the north by lands John Greer, of Arnold Custard, east by lands lately the property of Thomas &c. Greer, deceased, on the south by lands of Abraham Custard, and on the west by lands of the Pennsylvania Population Company; which deeds, when so executed, shall be considered as good and available in law, as if they had been executed by the said Thomas

Greer in his life time.
