and the said road, from thenceforth, shall be, to all intents and purposes, a public highway, and shall be opened and repaired as required by the original acts by which the said road was laid, and the part or parts of said road or roads, which is thereby altered or

relaid, be, and the same is hereby vacated.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each of the said commissioners, before they enter upon the duties of their appointment, shall take and subscribe, before some Commissionjustice of the peace, an oath or affirmation, faithfully and imparti-ers to be ally to perform the duties required of them by this act, and they firmed. shall each receive three dollars for each day they shall be necessarily employed in the said work, together with a reasonable allowance for chain carriers and one marker, and the accounts of the said commissioners shall be adjusted and settled by the county commissioners of Fayette and Greene, in proportion to the distance the said road passes through each county.
