SECT. IV. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That upon the settlement of the said accounts, the auditor general shall draw his warrant for any balance due to either of the persons aforesaid, on the state treasurer, who shall pay the same out of any unappropriated monies in the treasury.

CHAPTER CXXXII.

An ACT making appropriation to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned.

Clerk hire in secretary's office.

Land office.

Auditor general's office.

Treasury office.

Surveyor general's office.

SECT. I. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the payment of expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, viz. For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand three hundred dollars, together with the balance unexpended of the last appropriation: For clerk hire in the office of the secretary of the land office, for one year, commencing the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of sixteen hundred dollars, may be expended by said officer in the employment of as many clerks in his office as he may find necessary: For clerk hire in the office of the auditor general, one hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation of one thousand dollars, and the further sum of eleven hundred dollars, to pay for the employment of two additional clerks in said office, from the first day of April next: For clerk hire in the office of the state treasurer, two hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation of two thousand and sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents: For clerk hire in the office of the surveyor general, for one year, commencing on the first day of April aforesaid, the sum of two thousand six hundred dollars, which, together with the permanent appropriation of two thousand dollars for that office, may be expended by the surveyor general, in the employment of as many

clerks in his office as he may find necessary. And the clerk hire aforesaid, shall be paid quarterly, in the usual manner. For contingent expenses in the office of the secretary of the commonwealth, for one year, two thousand five hundred dollars: For contingent expenses in the office of the secretary of the land office, for one year, two thousand dollars: For contingent expenses in the office of the surveyor general, for one year, including the expenses of the board of property, six hundred dollars: For contingent expenses in the auditor general's office, one hundred dollars, in addition to the standing appropriation for stationary and a set of new books; and the sums hereby appropriated, shall be paid by the state treasurer out of any money in the treasury, previous to which, the officers holding the aforesaid offices, shall exhibit their accounts and vouchers for said expenditure, to the accountant department, to be adjusted and settled.

SECT. II. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That six hundred dollars be, and is hereby appropriated for the payment of an additional clerk in the office of state treasurer, if the business of the office shall at any time require it, which shall be paid quarterly in the usual manner.

SECT. III. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the accountant officers be, and they are hereby authorized to settle and adjust the expenses of the state treasurer, while engaged on public service near Philadelphia, in the fall of one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and such other miscellaneous claims against the commonwealth, not otherwise provided for, including a deficiency in the appropriation made for levelling the ground on the lot near the public buildings at Harrisburg: *Provided,* That it shall be the duty of said officers to report specially to the legislature the nature and amount of the demands paid under the provisions of this section.
