CHAPTER XXXIII.

An ACT authorising the election of a constable in the borough of Greensburg.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the electors of the borough of Greensburg, in the county of Westmoreland, shall annually, at the court-house in said berough, on the same day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, elect two reputable citizens in said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected, to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, one of whom shall be appointed in the same manner, under the same provisions, and subject to the same penalties as are provided and contained in the act entitled, "An act to amend and consolidate with its supplements, the act, entitled An act for the recovery of debts and demands not exceeding one hundred dollars before a justice of the peace, and for the election of constables, and for other purposes,? " passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten; and when such constable shall be so elected and appointed, he shall have and exercise equal power and authority with the constable of Hempfield township in said county, and be liable to the same penalties and provisions.

SECT. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforcsaid, That the high constable of the borough of Greensburg, be authorised and required to give previous notice, and to hold the

first election in pursuance of this act.

CHAPTER XXXIV.
