

## CHAPTER LXXII.

An ACT for the relief of James Moore, of Beaver county.

WHEREAS, by an act passed the twenty-second of January, one thousand eight hundred and three, a certain fractional part of the reserved tract at the mouth of Big Beaver creek, in Beaver county, was granted to James Moore, at one dollar and fifty cents per acre, to be paid in four equal yearly instalments, the first to be paid in one year after the passing of said act, at which time a warrant of survey was to have issued; but the said James Moore has hitherto failed to pay any part of said purchase money, by reason of which the officers of the land office cannot grant a title in the mode pointed out by the law, and they are not at liberty to adopt any other: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That as soon as James Moore, of Beaver county, or his legal representatives, shall pay two hundred and fifty dollars into the treasury of this commonwealth, on account of a certain fractional part of the reserved tract at the mouth of Big Beaver creek in Beaver county, granted to him by an act passed the twenty-second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and three, it shall be lawful for the secretary of the land office to grant him or them a warrant of survey, and on payment, within six years from the date hereof, of the whole amount of principal, interest and fees, that are or may become due according to the terms of the aforesaid act, the land officers shall issue a patent for the said land in the usual form.
