## CHAPTER XCII.

An ACT for holding special courts of common pleas.

Sect. 1. ## CHAPTER XCIII.

An ACT to enable the governor to subscribe to a certain number of shares in the stock of certain turnpike companies.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the governor be, and he is hereby required and instructed to subscribe for subscribe fifty shares in the capital stock of the Clifford and Wilkesbarre turnpike company, and one hundred shares in the capital stock of the Bridgewater and Wilkesbarre turnpike

company.

Secr. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That as soon as any section of the said roads, not less than five miles, shall be completed, the governor is further required and authorised to draw his warrant on the state treasurer in favour of the said company, for such part of the amount of stock to be paid by the commonwealth, as shall be in proportion to the whole distance of the said turnpike road, and so from time to time until the whole of said roads shall be completed.
