ed in the will of John Conrad, late of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, to the said corporation, by the name of the German Roman Catholic Church, called the Holy Trinity Church in the city of Philadelphia, and to execute, seal, and deliver, and in due form of law, acknowledge such conveyances and assurances of the said estate, unto the purchaser or purchasers thereof, their heirs and assigns for ever, as shall be requisite. *Provided*, That the said trustees and their successors, shall place out on mortgage on good real estate, the purchase money received by them for the said lot of ground and buildings, and apply the interest of the said mortgage as a fund for schooling of poor children belonging to the said congregation, gratis, agreeably to the true intent and meaning of the last will and testament of the said John Conrad.

CHAPTER II.

AN ACT

To vest in the trustees of the German religious society of Roman Catholics of the Holy Trinity Church, in the city of Philadelphia, the right of this Commonwealth, to the estate of Francis Doering, late of the city of Philadelphia, deceased.

Escheated
estate vested
in certain

SECT 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title and interest which this commonwealth may have acquired by reason of any escheat or supposed escheat, from the want of heirs or any known kindred of Francis Doering, formerly of the city of Philadelphia, deceased, in and to the estate, real and personal, whereof he died seized or possessed, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the trustees of the German religious so-*

ciety of Roman Catholics of the Holy Trinity Church, in the city of Philadelphia, to be held by them and their successors for ever. *Provided*, That no other right of this Commonwealth, except that derived by the said escheat or supposed escheat, shall pass by virtue of this act, nor shall the rights of individuals be in any wise affected or impaired thereby. Proviso.

CHAPTER III.

AN ACT

Authorising Esther Ottinger, Jacob Holgate and Aaron Keyser, executors of John Ottinger, deceased, to sell and convey part of a tract of land therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature, that John Ottinger of the township of Springfield, in the county of Montgomery, died siezed of a certain tract of land, containing about one hundred and fifty five acres, which together, with his stock and household and kitchen furniture, he bequeathed to his wife, until his youngest child should attain the age of fourteen years, which child is now about one year old ; and whereas there are no assets in the hands of the executors, to pay the debts of the said deceased.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Esther Ottinger, Jacob-Holgate and Aaron Keyser, executors of John Ottinger, deceased, or the survivor or survivors of them be, and they are hereby authorised to sell at public sale, after having given at least ten days public notice of the time and place of sale, so much of the real estate of the said deceased, as will be sufficient to pay the debts due by the testator at the time of his decease, and to discharge the expenses necessarily incurred in settling the same, and the* Executors of John Ottinger, deceased, authorised to sell and convey real estate.
