Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John Templeton and Joseph Meredith, administrators of the goods and chattles of Joseph Burley, deceased, or the survivor of them, be authorised to make and execute a deed of conveyance to Thomas Stephens, his heirs and assigns, in fee, for two adjoining tracts of land, situate in Tyrone township, in Huntingdon county, containing about one hundred and six acres, on his paying the balance due for the same, which title, so as aforesaid executed, shall be as good and valid in law as if it had been made in the life time of the said Joseph Burley: Provided, That nothing in this act contained shall be understood to injure or prejudice the right of any other individual or individuals.

CHAPTER XXIV.

AN ACT

For the relief of Thomas Clugage, a captain in the revolutionary war.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to Thomas Clugage, or his order, two hundred dollars, in full for his services as a captain in the revolutionary war.
