

upon giving security according to law to prosecute his, her or their appeal with effect, and the said court having taken such order therein as shall seem to them just and reasonable, the same shall be conclusive and bind all parties.

Repeal of former acts.

SECT. 18. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the first Monday in May next, the act entitled "An act to erect the town of Bedford into a borough," passed the thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, and the act entitled "An act to enlarge the limits of the borough of Bedford," passed the twenty-sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

AN ACT

To authorise the printing of the pamphlet laws of this Commonwealth.

3,000 copies to be printed.

Their form and price.

When to be delivered.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and hereby is authorised to contract for the printing of three thousand copies of the laws of the present and each of the two next succeeding sessions of the Legislature, on the best and most advantageous terms for the Commonwealth, not to exceed the rate of sixty dollars per sheet of sixteen pages, exacting a sufficient security for the faithful performance of the said contract, to be printed in octavo form, on paper number two of a medium size, with a good long primer type, each page to contain not less than eighteen hundred m's, including the marginal references, and the execution of the work generally to correspond with the pamphlet editions of the laws lately published by Jacob Elder, each of the said copies to be stitched and covered in pamphlet form, and to be delivered at the office of the Secretary of the

Commonwealth, at Harrisburg, on or before the first day of June in each year.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act passed the thirty-first of March, one thousand eight hundred and six, authorising the erection of a school-house near Sumanytown, in Montgomery county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the unexpended surplus sum of money which remains in the hands of the commissioners of the Sumanytown school-house lottery, in the county of Montgomery, be, and the same is hereby appropriated to the erection of a dwelling house, to be built on the same lot of ground on which the school-house is erected, for the accommodation of a teacher, to be applied to that purpose by the commissioners aforesaid.

Surplus money out of lottery, how to be appropriated.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in case of neglect or non-compliance with the foregoing within one year after the passage of this act, on the part of the commissioners, to perform the duties required of them by this act, Philip Reed and Henry Snyder, or the survivor of them, shall have full power, by law, to sue for, receive and recover the surplus sum of money which remains unexpended in the hands of the commissioners appointed by the fifth section of the act to which this is a further supplement, to be applied by them for the purpose aforesaid.

Suit may be brought if the money is not appropriated in the manner directed.
