# CHAPTER LVIII.

### AN ACT

To confirm title to land in Abraham Brinker.

WHEREAS Thomas Smith, by deed, did convey a certain piece or tract of land situate in Clearfield township, Butler county, containing one hundred and forty acres and allowance, to James Sharp, in trust for the children of the said Thomas Smith: And whereas the said James Sharp having died without acting thereon, the said Thomas Smith did afterwards, and whilst in possession thereof, convey the same premises to Abraham Brinker for a valuable consideration: and it is the desire of the children of the said Thomas Smith, that the title of the above mentioned land be confirmed in the said Abraham Brinker, in the same manner as if the deed of trust had never been executed: Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the title to one hundred and forty acres of land, with allowance, situate in Clearfield township, Butler county, sold by Thomas Smith to Abraham Brinker, be, and the same is hereby confirmed in the said Abraham Brinker, in the same manner as if a deed of trust from the said Thomas Smith to James Sharp, for the use of the children of the said Thomas Smith had never been executed.
