

## CHAPTER LXXXVIII.

## AN ACT

For the relief of Jacob Herrington, an old soldier.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he hereby is authorised and directed to pay unto Jacob Herrington, of Crawford county, or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars, to be paid half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen. Gratuity and annuity of \$40 to Jacob Herrington.

## CHAPTER LXXXIX.

## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act to amend the act, entitled "An act directing the mode of selling unseated lands for taxes, and for other purposes."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be the duty of the purchaser or purchasers at treasurer's sale, as soon as the property is struck down, to pay the amount of the purchase money, or such part thereof as shall be necessary to pay off the taxes and costs, as also one dollar for the use of the prothonotary for entering the acknowledgment of the deed; and in case the amount is not forthwith paid, after the property is struck down, the sale may be avoided, and the property immediately set up again by the treasurer: and it shall be discretionary with the commissioners of the respective counties, what lands they will purchase in for the use of the county.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered and supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.*

## CHAPTER XC.

### AN ACT

For the relief of Casper Stoner, an old soldier, and others.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay Casper Stoner, or order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and seventeen, to be paid half yearly during life.*

Gratuity and annuity of \$40 to Casper Stoner.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to Eve Dougherty, of Armstrong county, widow of Patrick Dougherty, a soldier in the late war, or her order, forty dollars immediately, and forty dollars annually, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, and to continue during the term of five years: Provided, That upon the death or marriage of the said Eve Dougherty, the annuity hereby granted shall be paid to the guardian or guardians of the minor children of the said Patrick Dougherty, deceased.*

Gratuity and annuity of \$40 to widow of Patrick Dougherty.

On her death or marriage to her children.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to Elizabeth Stickle, widow of John Stickle, late a soldier,*

Gratuity of \$50 to the widow of John Stickle.
