

## CHAPTER CXXI.

## AN ACT

Appropriating a further sum of money for opening and improving the state road from Logan's narrows, in the county of Huntingdon, to the state road leading to Presque Isle.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met. and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of eight hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated for opening and improving the state road from Logan's narrows, in the county of Huntingdon, across the Clearfield creek and river Susquehanna, above the mouth of Anderson's creek, in the county of Clearfield, to the state road which leads to Presque Isle; two hundred dollars of which sum shall be expended on that part of the road which is in the county of Huntingdon, and the remainder upon that part which is in the county of Clearfield. \$800 appropriated for a road from Logan's, &c.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required to draw his warrants upon the state treasurer in favor of William Berry, of Huntingdon county, and Abraham Keagy and Greenwood Bell, of Clearfield county, for the aforesaid sum of eight hundred dollars, to be expended by them in opening and improving said road; which sum shall be paid to them or their order, or the order of any two of them, on their entering into and executing such a contract, with sufficient sureties for the faithful and judicious expenditure of said money, in opening and improving the said road, with the Governor of the Commonwealth on its behalf, as shall be approved by him, to wit: For one half thereof at the time of the making such contract and giving such surety, and the other half on it appearing satisfactorily to him, that the first moiety has been faithfully expended in pursuance of this act. To whom the said money shall be paid.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said commissioners, or a majority of them, shall have power to vacate any part of the said road as now laid out and opened from Logan's narrows, on the ascent and to the top of the Allegheny mountain, in Huntingdon county, as they shall judge proper, and to lay out and open the same anew, on such ground as they shall find better adapted to the making a good road, with a more easy and uniform ascent, so as to strike the present road at or near the summit of said mountain. Commissioners may vacate parts of said road.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That in case the said commissioners, or any of them, should die or refuse or neglect to act, or to enter into such contract, or give sufficient surety for the faithful perform- Vacancies, how supplied

ance thereof, the Governor may and shall appoint one or more suitable person or persons in his or their place.

## CHAPTER CXXII.

### A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled “An act establishing an academy in the borough of Gettysburg, in the county of Adams, and granting a sum of money thereto.”

SECT. 1, *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the fifth section of the act to which this is a further supplement, as directs that one thousand dollars shall be placed in some safe productive fund or funds, and the income thereof to be applied to compensate a teacher or teachers in said academy, be, and the same is hereby repealed, and it shall be lawful for the trustees to apply the said sum towards payment of the debt incurred in the erection of said academy.*
