

CHAPTER CXXI.

AN ACT

For the relief of Peter Fricker, an old soldier.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Peter Fricker, or order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said Peter Fricker for life, to be paid to Frederick Heller, of the borough of Reading, his executors or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, to be paid half yearly, which annuity shall be expended in procuring clothing and diet for the said Peter Fricker; and it shall be and is hereby made the duty of the said Frederick Heller, his executors or administrators, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Berks county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act, and it shall be the duty of the clerk of said court to file the said account without fee or reward.
