

CHAPTER CXXI.

AN ACT

For the relief of Peter Fricker, an old soldier.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay unto Peter Fricker, or order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately after the passing of this act, and that an annuity of forty dollars be granted for the use of the said Peter Fricker for life, to be paid to Frederick Heller, of the borough of Reading, his executors or administrators, or his or their lawful attorney, to commence the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, to be paid half yearly, which annuity shall be expended in procuring clothing and diet for the said Peter Fricker; and it shall be and is hereby made the duty of the said Frederick Heller, his executors or administrators, to make an annual return to the orphans' court of Berks county, on oath or affirmation, how and in what manner he or they have executed the trust in him or them confided by this act, and it shall be the duty of the clerk of said court to file the said account without fee or reward.

CHAPTER CXXII.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the Springhouse tavern in Montgomery county, to the borough of Northampton, in the county of Lehigh, and to the town of Bethlehem, in the county of Northampton."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General*

Governor to draw his warrant in favor of the company for \$10,000.

Certificate of stock to be deposited with the treasurer.

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That as soon as the Springhouse, Northampton town and Bethlehem turnpike company shall have ten miles of the said road completed from the Springhouse tavern, and approved as is directed in and by the said act to which this is a further supplement, the Governor be, and he is hereby required to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of the said company, for the whole amount directed to be subscribed by the Governor, by the second section of the supplementary act, passed the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen; and the said company are hereby required, on receiving the said warrant, to cause a certificate for two hundred shares of the stock of said company to be deposited in the office of the state treasurer, and the dividends arising thereon shall, from time to time as they are declared, be paid by the treasurer of the said company into the state treasury.

CHAPTER CXLIII.

AN ACT

To provide for the erection of a house for the employment and support of the poor in the county of Adams.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That a house for the employment and support of the poor, shall be erected in the county of Adams, in the manner and under the conditions hereinafter prescribed and enacted.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the said county of Adams shall, at the general election next ensuing the passing of this act, in the manner prescribed for the election of members of the House of Representatives of this Commonwealth, elect five reputable citizens of the said county, whose duty it shall be, on or before the first day of May next after the election, to

Five persons to be elected to fix the site for the buildings, &c.
