CHAPTER CXLV.

AN ACT

To prevent the practice of wagering or betting on elections.

WHEREAS the practice of laying wages or bets on the event of any elections on the success of candidates for public offices, has a great tendency to promote immorality and corruption:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That wagering or betting on the event of an election, held under the constitution or laws of the United States, or the constitution or laws of this Commonwealth, are hereby prohibited, and all contracts or promises founded thereon are declared to be entirely null and void.

Betting on elections prohibited.

Penalty on betting.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said, That if any person shall, after the first day of August next, lay any wager or bet, or make any promise or engagement for the payment of money or the transfer of any other valuable thing, dependent on the event of any such election as aforesaid, or on the success of any candidate or candidates nominated for public office, he shall, on conviction thereof in any court of quarter sessions, or other court having similar jurisdiction, be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined in any sum not exceeding the whole amount of the sum betted by all the parties to the wager, nor less sum than twenty dollars: Provided, That such prosecution shall be
