CHAPTER CLVII.

AN ACT

To authorise John Wormley and Abraham Neidig to build a bridge overthe Conedogwinit creek.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for John Wormley and Abraham Neidig, to erect, build, support and maintain a good and substantial bridge over and across the Conedogwinit creek, at the mouth thereof: Provided, That the bridge so built shall in no way injure or impede the navigation of the said creek, and that no toll shall be demanded or taken from any person or persons passing or repassing the same: And provided, That nothing in this act shall extend to authorise the said John Wormley and Abraham Neidig, to erect or build a bridge on any private property, without the consent of the owner or owners thereof.

CHAPTER CLVIII.

AN ACT

Establishing Allegheny College, in the township of Mead and county of Crawford.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That there be erected and is hereby established, in the township of Mead, in the county of Crawford, a College for the education of youth in the learned, ancient and modern languages, in the liberal arts and sciences, and in all useful literature, the name, style and title of which said college, by

Allegheny college established.
