be the president of the meeting of the members so to be assembled for the purpose aforesaid; and it shall be the duty of the said tellers respectively to take down in writing the name of every member voting at such election, and that of the person for whom he shall vote, and make report thereof to their respective houses, in order that the same may be entered on their minutes; and when it shall appear that any person has been duly elected, duplicate certificates of such election shall be made out and signed by the president of the said meeting, and by each of the said tellers, one copy whereof shall be sent to the person elected, and the other shall be filed and recorded in the Secretary's office of this commonwealth.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Treasurer who shall be appointed according to oath or affir the provisions of this act, before he enters on the duties of mation, and give security. his office, shall take an oath or affirmation, and give bond with sureties in the sum and manner prescribed by the fortieth section of the act, entitled " An act to amend and consolidate the several acts relating to the settlement of the public accounts and the payment of the public monies, and for other purposes," passed the thirtieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eleven.

## AN ACT

For the relief of Michael Dearmond, an old soldier.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Michael Dearmond of Columbia county, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.

### CHAPTER III.

#### AN ACT

For the appointment of constables in the borough of Greencastle, in Franklin county,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the electors of the borough of Greencastle in the county of Franklin, shall annually, at the house now occupied by John Besore in said borough, on the day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships in Two constates the commonwealth, elect two reputable citizens of said borelected. ough, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, one of which shall be appointed in the same manner, with like powers and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties, as are provided and contained in the laws now existing, or that may hereafter exist, relative to constables within this commonwealth.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the court of quarter sessions of Franklin county Court to apshall, at their sessions in January one thousand eight hun-point one in dred and eighteen, appoint a suitable person to serve as con-the meanstable for said borough, until the usual time of appointing while. constables in the several townships in this commonwealth.
