CHAPTER V.

AN ACT

For the relief of Isaac Raymond, an old soldier.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to Isaac Raymond, late of Montgomery county, or order, forty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars during lite, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.

CHAPTER VI.

AN ACT

Confirming the titles of John Jacob Smith, to certain real estate thereis mentioned.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General

The title of John Jacob Smith confirmed. Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the title of John Jacob Smith, of the township of Bethlehem, in the county of Northampton, late an alien, to a tract or parcel of land situate in the township of Hanover, in the county of Lehigh, containing one hundred and nineteen acres, conveyed to him by Nicholas Kreamer and wife, by indenture dated the thirtieth day of September, eighteen hundred and sixteen; also two smaller tracts of land, one containing about six acres, in Forks township, the other containing near two acres, in the town of Altona, in the township of Bethlehem, both of them being in the county of Northampton, is hereby confirmed, as far as the same may be deficient on account of the said John Jacob Smith being an alien at the time of the purchase of the said lands: And any conveyance and assurances which he may make of the premises, shall be to all intents and purposes, as good and sufficient as if the said John Jacob Smith had been a citizen of the United States at the time he purchased the premises: Provided, That this act shall not affect the private rights of any individual or individuals, but the same shall remain as if this act had never been passed.

CHAPTER VII.

AN ACT

Supplementary to an act, entitled "An act to confirm and amend the charter of incorporation of the United Swedish Lutheran Churches of Wicaco, Kingsessing and Upper Merion, called Gloria Dei, St. James's, and Christ Church."

The Reverend Nicholas Collin, rector, Hugh De Haven, Paul Beck, jun. wardens, and William Jones, George Sheed, Andrew Keer, Samuel Rambo, Charles Wheeler, William Cox, John M. Justis, Sevan Boon, Matthias Holstein, vestrymen, being a majority of
