### CHAPTER XXXIII.

#### AN ACT

Relative to the Health Office in the port of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the thirty-fifth section of the act, entitled "An act for establishing a health office, and to secure the city and port of Philadelphia from the introduction of pestilential and contagious diseases, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-ninth day of January, eighteen hundred and eighteen, be and the same is hereby suspended until the first Monday of March next, and from thence until the members of the board of health shall be appointed, in the manner directed by the said act, and no longer.

# CHAPTER XXXIV.

#### A SUPPLEMENT

# CHPATER XXXV.

#### AN ACT

For regulating the importation of German and other passengers.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That every master or captain of any ship or vessel im-
