CHAPTER XLI.

AN ACT

To authorise the executors of David Smith, late of Westmoreland county, deceased, to convey a certain part of a tract of land in Fayette county.

WHEREAS it is represented to the legislature that Joseph Darlington, bound himself by articles of agreement dated the first of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, to convey a part of a tract of land in Fayette county, to Isaac M'Donald, deceased; that before the said conveyance was executed, the said Darlington sold the residue of the said tract to the reverend David Smith, under an express stipulation that the said Smith should patent in his own name the whole of said tract and convey the part aforesaid to the said M'Donald; that the said Smith always expressed a willingness so to do but was prevented by death; that the heirs of the said M'Donald have ever since enjoyed the peaceable and undisturbed possession of the said land, and have lately sold the same to Noble M'Cormick who declines paying them until a good conveyance is executed; that the executors of the said Smith are willing to execute the said conveyance but are unable to do so legally for want of written evidence of contract between their said testator and the said M'Donald.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the executor or executors of the reverend David Smith, late of Westmoreland county, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to make and execute to Abner M'Donald a good and sufficient deed in fee simple, and in due form of law acknowledge the same for part of a certain tract of land situate in Fayette county, lately sold by the heirs of Isaac M'Donald, deceased, to Noble M'Cormick, containing about eighteen acres and twenty-six perches more or less according to the metes and bounds described in the article of agreement made by and between Isaac M'Donald, deceased, and Joseph Darlington, and dated the first day of October one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, it being part of a larger tract of land sold by Joseph Darlington to the reverend David Smith, late of Westmoreland county, deceased: *Provided,* That nothing contained in this act shall in any wise impair the rights of any other individual or individuals whatsoever.

CHAPTER XLII.

AN ACT

For the relief of William M'Clean.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the accountant officers be, and there are hereby authorised and required to settle and adjust upon equitable principles the accounts and claims of William M'Clean for six days service of the team he had in the service of the state, and allow him pay equal to the pay and rations of an ensign
