

CHAPTER XLVI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act relative to the building of certain bridges over the Monongahela and Allegheny rivers opposite Pittsburg"

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required to draw his warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the river Monongahela opposite Pittsburg, in the county of Allegheny, for the sum of twenty thousand dollars, being the first instalment on sixteen hundred shares of the stock of said company held by this commonwealth, and that when the piers and abutments of said bridge shall have been constructed and finished, the Governor shall also draw his warrant on the State Treasurer in favor of the said president, managers and company for the further sum of twenty thousand dollars, which will be in full of the second and last instalment of the said sixteen hundred shares of stock.
