Mode of securing a passage for fish.

to confine the water to its width, the bottom of the slope to be tight so as to prevent the waste of water, and at the lower end to be on a level with the bed or bottom of the stream, which is to be secured from washing or wearing by the current; and in order that the passage of fish shall not be obstructed or impeded, there shall be upon the plane of each slope made of wood inequalities of surface not exceeding six inches higher than the plane of the slope so as to form small eddies or resting places for fish passing upward in every space of three feet, and in case any such slope shall be constructed with a bottom of plank or other smooth surface then cross pieces of timber not exceeding six inches in thickness, shall be pinned or otherwise well secured upon such surface crosswise, and not to exceed three feet asunder in the whole length of the slope.
