## CHAPTER LVI.

### AN ACT

To angul the marriage of John Merrills and Marinda his wife.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature that Marinda Merrills, late Marinda Bennet, of the township of Hanover, in the county of Luzerne, on or about the month of November one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, was lawfully married to John Merrills. And whereas at a court of quarter sessions held at Wilkesbarre in and for the county of Luzerne, on the first Monday of August one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, the said John Merrills was duly convicted of larceny and horse stealing, and sentenced by the said court to undergo an imprisonment at hard labor in the jail and penitentiary house of the city and county of Philadelphia, where he is now in confinement.

# Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into by and between John Merrills and Marinda his wife, late Marinda Bennet, both late of the county of Luzerne, be, and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract, and from all duties and obli-
