CHAPTER LXXXIX.

AN ACT

Authorising Sarah W. Fisher, Coleman Fisher and S. Rhoads Fisher, adadministrators of the estate of Samuel W. Fisher, deceased, to sell certain lands therein mentioned.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature that Samuel W. Fisher, late of the city of Philadelphia, died on the tenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen, intestate, seized in his demesne as of fee, of and in certain tracts of land situate in the counties of Luzerne, Lycoming, Tioga, Huntingdon, Cambria, Clearfield, Indiana and Bradford, containing twenty-eight thousand acres more or less; that for the most part the said lands are unimproved.

Therefore.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the said Sarah W. Fisher, Coleman Fisher and S. Rhoads Fisher, administrators of the estate of Samuel W. Fisher, or a majority of them, the said Sarah being one, or in case of her decease the said Coleman and S. Rhoads or either of them, together with the guardian of her minor children, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell either by public or private sale, at such times and upon such terms as shall appear to them most for the interest of the estate of the said intestate, all or any part of the lands of which the said Samuel W. Fisher died seized, situate in the counties of Luzerne, Lycoming, Tioga, Huntingdon, Cambria, Clearfield, Indiana and Bradford, or elsewhere within this commonwealth, and to execute sufficient and valid deeds or other conveyances to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, or any part thereof, and to enter into any contract or contracts in relation to the said lands as fully and effectually as the said Samuel W. Fisher in his lifetime might have done: Provided, That the said administrators shall pay over to the guardian of the said minor children their respective shares of the money arising from the sale of the said lands, as the same from time to time shall be received.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That it shall be the duty of the said Sarah W. Fisher, Coleman Fisher and Samuel Rhoads Fisher, or such of them, or such other persons as under the provisions of the first section of this act shall sell or convey any of the lands therein mentioned, before making any such sale and conveyance to enter into recognizance with sufficient surety before the or-

phan's court for the city and county of Philadelphia in such sum as they shall direct, for the faithful exercise of the powers and execution of the duties given or required by this act.

CHAPTER XC.

AN ACT

Granting relief to James English, a sergeant in the revolutionary army.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed to pay to James English, a sergeant in the Pennsylvania line in the revolutionary war, in captain Jacob Bower's company, or to his order, forty-eight dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty-eight dollars to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January eighteen hundred and eighteen,
