CHAPTER XCVI

AN ACT

For the election of certain constables.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors residing in the township of East Pennsboro' in the county of Cumberland, shall at the usual time appointed by law for the election of constables, yearly and every year after the passing of this act, elect two suitable persons inhabitants of said township for the office of constable, in addition to the two persons elected under the existing laws of this commonwealth, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace to be holden for said county; and the said court shall appoint one of them constable for said township, which constable when so appointed by the court shall have the same powers, and be subject to all the penalties and regulations which constables have and are subjected to under the laws relative to constables which now or hereafter may exist within this commonwealth.

East Pennsboro township to elect two additional persons for constables.

Court to appoint one of them.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing within the city of Pittsburg qualified to vote for members of the General Assembly, shall on the fourth Monday of May next, and on the first Tuesday of January annually thereafter, meet at the court house in said city and elect four suitable persons in the eastern ward, and four such persons in the western ward of said city for

the office of constable, and make a regular return of such election to the court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county; and the said court shall appoint two of the persons so elected to serve as constables for the eastern ward, and two of them. the persons elected as aforesaid to serve as constables for the western ward of said city, conformably to law.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That on the day appointed by law for the election of constables in the borough of York, the electors residing in the said borough shall in each year elect four suitable persons being citizens of the borough for the office of constable, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of the peace to be holden for the county of York, and the court shall appoint two of them constables for the said borough conformably to law.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the qualified electors of the borough of Gettysburg in the county of Adams, shall annually at the court house in the said borough on the day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships of this commonwealth, elect four reputable citizens of said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, two of whom shall be appointed in the same manner, with like power and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing or that may hereafter exist concerning constables within this commonwealth; and the constables so appointed are hereby severally authorised and required to receive and execute all writs and process lawfully issued by the burgess and town council of said borough, and to do and perform all such other duties as are enjoined upon the high constable of said borough by the act of assembly, entitled " An act to incorporate the town of Gettysburg in the county of Adams," passed the tenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and six, and that so much of said act as is hereby altered or supplied be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the township of Swatara in the county of Dauphin, shall annually on the day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, hereafter elect four suitable persons inhabitants of said township, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next general court of quarter sessions to be held for the county of Dauphin, two of whom shall be appointed constables for said township, in the same manner, with like powers and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the several laws of this commonwealth relating to constables.

Borough of York to elect four persons for constables.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors of the borough of Bedford in Bedford county, shall annually at the court house in said borough, on the day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, elect four reputable citizens of said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, two of whom shall be appointed constables for said borough, in the same manner with like power and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing, or that may hereafter exist concerning constables within this commonwealth; and the town constable of the borough of Bedford is hereby authorised and required to give previous notice, and to hold the first election in said borough in pursuance of this act, and so much of any law of this commonwealth as is hereby altered or supplied be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Borough of Washington to elect four persons for constables.

Court to appoint two.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That on the day appointed by law for the election of constables in the borough of Washington, the electors residing in said borough shall in each year elect four suitable persons being citizens of the borough for the office of constable, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of the peace to be holden for the county of Washington, and the court shall appoint two of them constables for the said borough, conformably to law.

Unincorporated part of the Northern Liberties to elect four persons for constables.

Court to appoint two.

SECT. 8. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the electors residing within the bounds of the unincorporated part of the township of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, shall hereafter on the day appointed by law for the election of constables, elect four suitable persons residing within the bounds of the said unincorporated part of the Northern Liberties, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions to be holden for the county of Philadelphia, and the court shall appoint two of them constables for the said unincorporated part of the township aforesaid, conformably to law; and so much of any act or acts as authorises the election of a greater number of constables in the township of the Northern Liberties than are herein specified, except in the incorporated part thereof, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Laws relative to constables in Moyamensing extended to Passyunk.

SECT. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all the existing laws respecting the election and sureties of constables in the township of Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, shall be, and they hereby are extended to the township of Passyunk in the county aforesaid, and that so much of the laws relating to the election and sureties of constables which are now in operation in the said

township of Passyunk, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XCVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An act for securing the city of Philadelphia and the neighbourhood thereof from damage by gunpowder.”

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of May next it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to import or introduce gunpowder within the following limits excepting as hereinafter directed, that is to say, No vessel having a greater quantity than five kegs of gunpowder shall be permitted to anchor north of the pier next above the Point House on the river Delaware, in the township of Moyamensing, and county of Philadelphia, and all gunpowder brought up the Delaware shall be landed at the aforesaid pier, and when the same is intended to be conveyed to the United States arsenal or the state magazine, the same shall be transported thither by the most convenient route not approaching nearer to the city than as follows, viz. Beginning opposite to the east end of Keeler’s lane on the margin of the river Delaware, thence westward along the said lane and the southern boundary of Southwark to Passyunk road, thence up the said road to Federal road, thence westward along the same to Gray’s ferry road, thence up the same directly to the said United States arsenal on the east bank of the river Schuylkill.

Introduction of gunpowder regulated. Where vessels having more than 5 kegs shall anchor. Where gunpowder shall be landed and how transported.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all gunpowder brought down the river Delaware, if intended to be transported by land either to the arsenal, magazine or pier aforesaid, the same shall be landed at Conroe & Co’s. wharf in the village of Richmond, in the
