## CHAPTER CXV.

### *A SUPPLEMENT*

To the act, entitled "An act providing for the sale of the State House and State House Square in the city of Philadelphia.

WHEREAS by an act passed on the thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia were required to take charge of the State House in the city of Philadelphia, and to lease the same in the name of the commonwealth, giving a preference of all the upper part of the house to the proprietor of the museum. And whereas by another act passed on the eleventh day of March eighteen hundred and sixteen, the Governor is authorised to contract with the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia for the sale of the said State House and Square with the exception of certain lots; and in pursuance of such power the Governor did on the twenty-third day of April in the year last aforesaid, sell to the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia, the premises mentioned, payable in three annual instalments, two whereof have been paid into the Bank of Pennsylvania to the credit of the commonwealth. And whereas it has been represented that the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia refuse to deliver up possession of the lower part of the said house to the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia,

shall forthwith deliver possession of the lower part of the State House in the city of Philadelphia to the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia, and in case of their neglecting or refusing so to do, on notice in writing being given by the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia of such neglect or refusal to the sheriff of the city and county of Philadelphia, the said sheriff is hereby required and enjoined to deliver possession of the said premises to the said mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia, in the same manner as sheriffs are directed to do by the act for the sale of goods distrained for rent, passed the twenty-first day of March seventeen hundred and seventy-two.

## CHAPTER CXVI.

### *AN ACT*

To compensate Thomas Stokely, a captain of rangers serving on the frontiers during the revolutionary war.

WHEREAS the provisions of certain acts of assembly passed on the first of March seventeen hundred and eighty, the tenth of April seventeen hundred and eighty-one, and the first of October seventeen hundred and eighty-one, have been considered not literally to extend to or embrace the case of Thomas Stokely, who from a change of and continuance in service or captivity during the whole war, could be deemed a supernumerary or deranged officer as described in said act; and it is unjust that by the continuance of his service or captivity he should be deprived of equal pay and emoluments to those enjoyed by other officers, who neither served or suffered to the extent he has done.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the*
