CHAPTER CXIX.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act for holding special courts of common pleas.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That whenever it shall happen that the president of in what cases any judiciary district within this commonwealth, is personal-suits shall be ly interested in the event of any suit or action now pending subject to the or hereafter to be instituted in any county of his district, or jurisdiction shall have been concerned as council for either of the parties, or of special others under whom they or either of them claim, touching the common same subject matter, or whenever it shall happen that the ti-pleas tle under which the parties or either of them in any such suit or action, claim shall have been derived from or through such president, then and in either of these cases, all such suits or action shall, and they are hereby declared to be subject to the jurisdiction of the special courts of common pleas mentioned in the act to which this a supplement, and shall be proceeded in to trial, judgment and execution in the manner directed by said act: Provided, That the parties to any cause Proviso. embraced within this act, may consent to a trial before the president of the court where the suit shall have been commenced, or before such president and any one or more of his associates, or before his associates: And provided also, That in all cases to be tried by a special court, the associate judges 2d provise. of the court where such cause shall have been commenced, shall have power at their regular terms to make all necessary A rules and orders preparatory to the trial of such causes.

CHAPTER CXX.

AN ACT

To confirm to John Ewing Porter the name of John Ewing Parker, and to confirm to Samuel Tate the name of Samuel Tate Swansy.

John Ewing Parker's name confirmed.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the name of John Ewing Parker, be, and the same in hereby confirmed to John Ewing Porter, and that in and by the said name of John Ewing Parker he may at all times hereafter lawfully sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, take; hold, occupy, possess and enjoy, grant, bargain, sell, release and convey property of whatsoever kind, whether real, personal or mixed, and to do and perform all and every such acts, matters and things as he otherwise might or could lawfully do in and by the name of John Ewing Porter.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Samuel Tate, a justice of the peace of Franklin county, shall hereafter be known by the name of Samuel Tate Samuel Tate Swansy, and by the same name shall be able and capable in to be known law to sue and be sued, grant, take, inherit and receive, and do all other legal acts, as well in courts of justice as elseof Samuel Tate Swansy, where as effectually to all intents and purposes as he could have done by his former name if no change had been made

therein.
