CHAPTER CXX.

AN ACT

To confirm to John Ewing Porter the name of John Ewing Parker, and to confirm to Samuel Tate the name of Samuel Tate Swansy.

John Ewing Parker's name confirmed.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the name of John Ewing Parker, be, and the same in hereby confirmed to John Ewing Porter, and that in and by the said name of John Ewing Parker he may at all times hereafter lawfully sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, take; hold, occupy, possess and enjoy, grant, bargain, sell, release and convey property of whatsoever kind, whether real, personal or mixed, and to do and perform all and every such acts, matters and things as he otherwise might or could lawfully do in and by the name of John Ewing Porter.

Samuel Tate to be known by the name of Samuel Tate Swansy.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That Samuel Tate, a justice of the peace of Franklin county, shall hereafter be known by the name of Samuel Tate Swansy, and by the same name shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, grant, take, inherit and receive, and do all other legal acts, as well in courts of justice as elsewhere as effectually to all intents and purposes as he could have done by his former name if no change had been made therein.
