CHAPTER CXXVI.

AN ACT

Granting to the American Antiquarian Society a copy of the laws and journals of this commonwealth.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Secretary of the Commonwealth, be, and he is hereby authorised and required to deliver when demanded, to the secretary of the "American Antiquarian Society," of Worcester, Massachusetts, for the use of the said society, or his order, one complete set or copy of the statute laws and journals of the legislature of this commonwealth, or so far as the same can be obtained at the seat of government, free of any charge to the said society whatsoever.

CHAPTER CXXVII.

AN ACT

Making appropriations to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for the payment of the expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to with the office of For clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth for one year, two thousand three hundred dollars.
