AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Tunkhannock in Luzerne county, to Wysox in Bradford county.

Secr. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That J. M. Piollet, Jonathan Stevens, John Hollen-Commissionback, Salmon Keeney, Daniel Sterling, Cyrus Avery and ers named. Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That when twenty or more persons shall have subscribed

one hundred or more shares in the said books, the said com-When letters missioners respectively may, and when the whole number of shares shall be subscribed, shall certify under their hands and seals the names of the subscribers and the number of shares by them subscribed to the Governor; and thereupon it shall be lawful for the Governor by letters patent under his hand and the seal of the state to erect and create the subscribers, and if the subscription be not full at the time, then those who shall thereafter subscribe to the number aforesaid, into one body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, Style & title, style and title of "The Tunkhannock and Wysox Turnpike

company," and by the said name the subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their capital stock, and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same by new subscriptions in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act. and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns in fee simple or for any less estate all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estates real and personal as shall be necessary and convenient to them in the prosecution of their works, and the same to sell and dispose of at their pleasure, and of suing and being sued, and doing all and every other thing which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do. said, That the six persons first named in the letters patent as soon as conveniently may be after sealing the same, shall give notice in at least two papers printed in the counties of Luzerne and Bradford, of a time and place by them to be appointed, not less than thirty days from the time of issuing the first notice, at which time and place the said subscribers shall proceed to organize the said corporation, and shall choose by a majority of votes of the said subscribers, by ballot to be delivered in person or by proxy duly authorised, one president, six managers, one treasurer, and such other officers as they shall think necessary to conduct the business of the said company for one year, and until such other officers shall be chosen, and may make such bye-laws, rules, orders and regulations not inconsistent with the laws and constitution of this state or of the United States, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the corporation, and the said company when thus incorporated shall have power, and is hereby authorised to make an artificial turnpike road commencing at Tunkhannock on the east side of the Susquehanna river, at or near Route of the where the Wilkesbarre and Bridgewater turnpike road crosses the said river, thence following as far as practicable the main post route leading up the river to or near a guide board standing near the house of J. M. AN ACT

To repeal the act, entitled "An act to raise by way of lottery a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars, to defray the expenses of building a church in the town of Somerset, and for other purposes."
