like tolls, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, re-
strictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures which are given and
granted to or imposed upon the president, managers and com-
pany of the Susquehanna and Lehigh turnpike road, in and
by an act passed the nineteenth day of March one thousand
eight hundred and four.

Placed on the same footing as the Susquehanna and Lehigh company.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said,* That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on the
said work in five years after the passing of this act, or shall
not within five years thereafter complete the said road, the
rights, liberties and franchises hereby granted to the said
company, shall revert to this commonwealth.

Time limited to commence and complete the road.

CHAPTER CXXIX.

AN ACT

To repeal the act, entitled “An act to raise by way of lottery a sum not
exceeding three thousand dollars, to defray the expenses of building a
church in the town of Somerset, and for other purposes.”

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-
sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General
Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the
same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the act en-
titled “An act to raise by way of lottery a sum not exceed-
ing three thousand dollars, to defray the expenses of building
a church in the town of Somerset,” passed the eleventh day
of February, one thousand eight hundred and five, shall be,
and the same is hereby repealed.

Repeal.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said,* That the judges of the court of common pleas of Somer-
set county, at their first session or as soon as may be, are
hereby authorised and required to appoint three honest and
disinterested persons as auditors to adjust and settle upon
equitable principles, the accounts of the commissioners ap-
pointed by the act which is hereby repealed, namely, Peter

Allowance to the commissioners. Kimmel, Abraham Morrison, Jacob Schneider, Abraham Miller, John Kantlinger and James Clark, allowing them such reasonable compensation as may appear to them just for their services and expenses incurred by them in discharge of their duties under the said act, and charging them with interest on all monies during such time as it shall have been in their hands, and the sums which shall have been paid by any person or persons for tickets or otherwise, in pursuance of the said act, shall be refunded and paid back to such person or persons, their heirs or representatives, by the said commissioners, in such manner as the said auditors shall direct and award, who shall also direct how and in what manner the expenses aforesaid shall be paid, who shall make a full report and statement of their proceedings therein to the next court of common pleas, which, if approved by the court, shall be good and available in law to all intents and purposes.

Charges against them.

In what cases the commissioners bonds shall be void. **SECT. 3.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That after the settlement and adjustment of the accounts of the said commissioners, by the auditors appointed by the court shall have been made for that purpose as aforesaid, and the award or report of the said auditors shall have been fully complied with by the said commissioners, then and in such case the bonds given by the said commissioners to the Governor of this commonwealth, for the true and faithful performance of their duties enjoined by the said act, be and the same are hereby declared to be hereafter null and void to all intents and purposes.

Monies awarded, how recoverable. **SECT. 4.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That after such report or award shall be made by the auditors aforesaid to the court of common pleas, agreeably to the provisions of this act, and the same shall be approved by the court as aforesaid, all parties interested therein shall be entitled to recover the sums of money therein awarded to them respectively, in the same manner as debts of equal amount are by law recoverable.

Compensation to the auditors. **SECT. 5.** *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said auditors shall be entitled to the same compensation for their services under this act, as arbitrators are entitled to receive under the act, entitled "An act regulating arbitrations," passed the twentieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, to be paid in such manner as the court under the circumstances may think proper to direct.
