CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to incorporate and endow an Academy or Public School in the borough of Reading, in the county of Berks.

WHEREAS by the act to which this is a supplement, five thousand acres of land, together with six per centum allowance for roads, was granted to the Reading Academy to be laid out, surveyed and patented free of expense. And whereas it is represented by the trustees of the said academy that owing to a mistake of the deputy surveyor five thousand four hundred and forty-eight acres and eighty-one perches of land, have been surveyed and returned on warrants taken out in pursuance of the said grant, and that the officers of the land office conceive they have not the power to grant a patent for the same.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the officers of the land office be, and they are hereby authorised and required to accept of the surveys made for the Reading Academy, on warrants issued in pursuance of the act to which this is a supplement, and deliver a patent for the land contained therein to the trustees of the Reading Academy on demand, free of expense.
