CHAPTER CXXXIX.

AN ACT

To annex part of Wayne township in Lycoming county, to Miles township in Centre county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of May next, all that part of Wayne township in Lycoming county, that includes Part of the east end of Sugar valley, beginning on the summit of a ship, Lycommountain north of Sugar valley at a water pond, on the diving county, sion line between Lycoming and Centre counties, thence an annexed to east course to the head waters of Sinking Fishing creek in-Miles towncluding Henry Barners' farm, thence a south course to the ship, Centre Union county line, be, and the same is hereby annexed to Miles township in Centre county.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all taxes and arrearages of taxes now assessed and monies now unpaid, within the said part of Wayne township, before the due to be passing of this act, and all sums of money due to this common-collected and wealth in the said part of Wayne township shall be collected paid as beand paid as if this act had not passed, and all persons living fore. within the aforesaid part of Wayne township shall be subject to the same military discipline and restrictions as the people of Miles township are subject to.

CHAPTER CXL.

AN ACT

To alter the time of holding the courts of Quarter Sessions and Common Pleus in the county of Dauphin.

Smor. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That after the fifteenth day of May next the regular terms of the courts of general quarter sessions of the peace and common pleas for Dauphin county, shall be held in each year on the last Monday of June, to continue not more than one week; on the first Monday after the second Tuesday in October, and on the second Mondays of December and March, subject in other respects to the laws now in force relative to the present existing courts in the said county.

CHAPTER CXLI.

AN ACT

Declaring Bennett's branch of Sinnamahoning in the county of Clearfield, a public highway.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this act, Bennett's branch of Sinnamahoning in the county of Clearfield, from the mouth thereof up to the Beaver dams so called, be, and the same is hereby declared a public highway for the passage of rafts, boats or other vessels, and it shall and may be lawful for the inhabitants desirous of using the navigation of said creek, to remove all natural and artificial obstructions from the bed or channel of said creek, excepting mill dams or other water works, and to erect such slopes or locks, and to keep the same in repair at the dams now built, as may be necessary for the passage of rafts, boats, arks and other vessels: Provided, Such slopes or locks be so constructed as not to injure said dams: And provided also, That any person or persons owning or possessing lands on said creek, may construct or erect any dam or dams across the same, agreeably and subject to all the restrictions and provisions of an act, entitled "An act to authorise any person or persons owning lands
