## CHAPTER CXLV.

### AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to view and lay out certain state roads therein mentioned.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor is hereby authorised to appoint three \*disinterest commissioners, one of whom shall be a practical surveyor, to view and lay out a road at least thirty appoint three feet wide from the meeting house at Mr. Johnston's, in commission. Kishacoquillas valley, by the nearest and best route to interers to lay out sect the state road from Bellefonte to Erie, at Glen's tavern on Bald Eagle creek; and the said commissioners shall proceed to perform the service at such time as the Governor shall direct, and shall ascertain the distance the said road runs through the counties of Mifflin and Centre respectively, and note the same on the draft of the road, of which they shall make three and mark the courses and distances of the road on them, of which they shall certify and send one to the Secretary of this Commonwealth, one to the court of quarter sessions of the county of Mifflin and one to the court of quarter sessions of the county of Centre.

SECT. 2. ### AN ACT

Extending the benefits of an act, entitled "An act securing to mechanics and others payment for their labor and materials in erecting any house or other building in the city and county of Philadelphia, to the mechanics and others of the counties of Cumberland, Northumberland, Columbia and Beaver, and for other purposes."

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-
