AN ACT

To repeal the third section of "An act making further provision for the support of the Board of Wardens of* the port of Philadelphia."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the third section of the act, entitled "An act making further provision for the support of the Board of Wardens for the port of Philadelphia," passed the twenty eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, be, and the same hereby is repealed.

CHAPTER IX.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from Waynesburg in Greene county, to intersect the Brownsville and Somerset turnpike road at or near Connellsville in Fayette county.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to appoint three disinterested commissioners one of whom shall be a practical surveyor, to lay out and mark a state road from the town of Waynesburg in Greene county, passing through Uniontown, to intersect the Brownsville and Somerset turnpike road at or near Connellsville in the county of Fayette, the elevation of which road shall at no point exceed an angle of five degrees. And the said commissioners or a majority of them shall proceed to perform the duties required of them by this act, on or before the first Monday of

June next, and shall cause a draft of said road to be deposited in the office of the Secretary of this Commonwealth, and shall also deposit a copy of said draft in the office of the clerk of quarter sessions of the respective counties through which said road may pass, which shall be a record thereof, and from thenceforth the said road shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and shall be opened and repaired in all respects as other roads are opened and repaired, which are laid out by order of the courts of quarter sessions of the counties aforesaid.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That each of the said commissioners before he enters on the duties of said appointment, shall take and subscribe before some justice of the peace an oath or affirmation, faithfully and impartially to perform the duties required of him by this act, and shall receive two dollars for each day he or they shall be necessarily employed in said work, together with a reasonable allowance for chain carriers and one marker, and the accounts of said commissioners shall be adjusted and settled by the county commissioners of Fayette and Greene, and paid out of the respective county treasuries on warrant drawn by the county commissioners of the same, in proportion to the distance the said road may pass through each county.
