CHAPTER XII.

· AN ACT

To provide for the more speedy publication and distribution of the laws of this commonwealth.

Duty of the wealth.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, as soon as any law or laws is, or are deposited in Secretary of his office, sufficient to form one octavo sheet, to prepare the the Common-same for the press, to affix thereto proper marginal notes, stating the purport of each paragraph or section, and to cause the same to be immediately printed in octave form, and to collate with and correct the proof sheets by the original rolls. and immediately upon the printing thereof to cause to be delivered to the clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives four copies for the use of the Senate and ten copies for the use of the House of Representatives respectively.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority afore. said, That within one month after the close of each session of the legislature, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall Index to the make a concise and complete index of the contents of the acts when to acts of Assembly passed thereat, which index shall be printed be made. and included in the pamphlet containing the said acts, and Pamphlets when the said pamphlets shall be completely printed, the when to be same shall be forwarded and distributed in the numbers and mode now by law directed.

And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Secretary of the Commonwealth be, and he Fourteen adis hereby required to contract for the printing of fourteen ditional cocopies of the laws in addition to the number now required by pies of the law, under the same terms and regulations as are now precontracted for.

CHAPTER XIII.

ANACT

To erect the town of Shippensburg, in the county of Cumberland, into a borough, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the town of Shippensburg, in the county of Cumberland, comprised within the following limits, to wit. Beginning at a post in the centre of the road leading from Adams street to Middle Spring, thence by a line dividing lands of Limits of the Patrick Cochran and James Chester to a post in the road borough. leading from Jefferson street to Middle Spring aforesaid, thence a straight line crossing lands of Doctor Simpson and others, to a post in the meadow of David Mahon's heirs twenty-two perches on the north side of the main street of said town, thence south forty-five degrees east by a line dividing lands of William Barr and town lot of Isaac Miller seventy nine perches to a post in lands of said William Barr, thence south forty-five degrees west one hundred and seventy-one perches and five-tenths to a post in lands of William Beard,
