Cartney, late of Westmoreland county, deceased, which they have or could claim in right of their mother Jane Coulter, deceased, from or under the last will and testament of the said George M. Cartney, deceased, to Andrew, Samuel and George M Cartney, and to their heirs and assigns: Provided, The said James Coulter shall previously secure the payment of the distributive share of the estate of the said George M Cartney, deceased, due to the said Mary and Elizabeth, according to a valuation thereof made in pursuance of the last will and testament of the said George: And provided also, That the said James Coulter shall enter into a recognizance in the orphan's court of Indiana county, with such surety as shall be approved by the court, conditioned for the payment of the share which shall be due the said Mary and Elizabeth respectively, at their arrival at the age of twenty-one years.

## CHAPTER XVIII.

## AN ACT

Relative to escheated estates.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same. That any person who hath died or shall die intestate, A surviving leaving a wife or husband and no heirs or other known kinband authoridred, and being seized or possessed at the time of his or her sed to enjoy death, of real or personal estate, the same shall vest in and escheated esbe enjoyed by such surviving wife or husband, and he or she tate. shall hold the same for such estate as the decedent had or held therein.
