## CHAPTER XXIV.

## AN ACT

To authorise the Governor to appoint Commissioners to lay out a State Road from the town of Kittaning, in a direction to the mouth of Anderson's creek.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to Governor to appoint three commissioners, one of whom shall be a practical appointthree surveyor, to view, mark and lay out a state road from the commissiontown of Kittaning, thence by the nighest and best route on ers. a direction towards the mouth of Anderson's creek, in Clear.
