CHAPTER XXV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act regulating banks."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That if any bank or banks within this commonwealth. shall after the date of this act, tender or offer in payment to this commonwealth for any per centage or debts due to the same, any note or notes professing to be payable on demand by banks which do not pay specie for the same, the State Treasurer shall refuse to receive the same.

State Treasurer to refuse notes not pavable in specie.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised to receive from the Farmer's Bank of Lancaster such sum in specie or in notes equal thereto, in lieu of such notes to exchange as may have heretofore been deposited with him by said bank certain notes for which specie cannot be received, and to return to said with the Far. for which specie cannot be received, and to return to said mer's Bank bank the said notes last mentioned, and the receipt thereof by of Lancaster the treasurer shall have the same force and effect as if the Effect there same had been paid within two months after the first Monday in November last.

Sect. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That no judge of any court nor any person holding any office under this commonwealth, in the accounting or treasution to be di. ry department, or in the land offices, or any person authorised to receive and account for the public monies of this commonwealth, shall be capable at the same time of being a director or cashier of any bank.
