CHAPTER XXXIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to provide for the erection of a State Penitentiary on the public land adjoining the town of Allegheny opposite Pittsburg, and for other purposes."

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repres sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners appointed in pursuance of the Commissionprovisions of the act to which this is a supplement, shall be, and they hereby are authorised to employ a clerk whose duty it shall be to take care of the books and papers, and perform such other duties as may be directed by the commissioners aforesaid; and the said clerk shall receive for his services such compensation as the commissioners may direct, not exceeding three hundred dollars per annum, and payable quarterly by the State Treasurer on certificates drawn by the commissioners aforesaid, out of the monies already appro-

priated by the act to which this is a supplement.
