CHAPTER XLIII.

AN ACT

For the relief of the widow and heirs of James Carson, deceased, late recorder of deeds for the city and county of Philadelphia.

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the legislature that James Carson, late recorder of deeds for the city and county of Philadelphia, died indebted to the commonwealth in the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars or thereabouts, for tax on the proceeds of his office, leaving a small much encumbered estate, inadequate to the support of his widow and minor children during their minority and the payment of said debts, and that an action has been instituted in the supreme court of the eastern district for the recovery of the same.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the estate of James Carson, deceased, late recorder of deeds for the city and county of Philadelphia, be, and the same is hereby exonerated and discharged from the payment of the balance due to the commonwealth arising from a tax on said office, and that the suit instituted for the recovery of said balance, be, and the same is hereby discontinued on payment of costs by the said estate.
