CHAPTER XLV.

AN ACT

For the relief of lieutenant John Painter, and others.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature that lieutenant John Painter, lieutenant Richard Martin, Thomas Martin and William Hoffman, of Northumberland county, did perform considerable military services during the revolutionary war in aiding to protect the then frontier settlements, having assurances from colonel Thomas Hartley commandant of that district of country, of being compensated, and they having never received any pay for said services, nor any person for them.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby required to pay to lieutenant John Painter, lieutenant Richard Martin, Thomas Martin and William Hoffman, of Northumberland county, or their orders respectively, the sum of two hundred dollars each, in full for services rendered during the revolutionary war.
