

veyance, shall vitiate or defeat the same, if the said corporation shall be sufficiently described, to ascertain the intent of the party or parties, to give, devise, bequeath, assure to or contract with the corporation hereby created by the name aforesaid. Nor shall any of the non uses of the said privileges hereby granted, create any forfeiture of the same, but the same may be exercised by the said corporation, and notwithstanding any failure to meet at any of the times appointed herein, or by the by laws and ordinances of the said society, to hold their annual or other meetings for elections or other subjects for consideration, the officers then in office shall continue to hold and exercise their respective offices until others shall be duly elected to succeed them at some future meeting of the said society, which the said corporation is hereby authorised to hold for such purpose.

Non user not to create forfeiture nor failure to meet.

Officers to continue.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if at any time the said corporation shall misuse or abuse any of the privileges granted by this act, or if it shall appear that the said privileges are injurious to the citizens of this commonwealth, the legislature shall have power to revoke and annul them at any time, they may deem the same expedient.

Power reserved to revoke their privileges.

CHAPTER LV.

AN ACT

Authorising the election of a constable in the borough of Pottstown in the county of Montgomery, and an additional constable in each of the townships of Washington and Dunbar in the county of Fayette.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified electors of the borough of Pottstown in the county of Montgomery, shall annually hereafter, at the

place where they usually meet for the election of borough officers, on the day appointed for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, elect two reputable citizens of said borough, and return the names of the persons so elected, to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, one of whom shall be appointed constable of said borough, in the same manner, with like power and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing or that may hereafter exist concerning constables within this commonwealth; and the high constable of the borough of Pottstown is hereby authorised and required to give previous notice, and to hold the first election in said borough in pursuance of this act.

One of whom to be appointed constable.
Duty of high constable.

Washington and Dunbar townships, Fayette county.
Four persons to be elected,
And two appointed constables.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the qualified electors of the townships of Washington and Dunbar, in the county of Fayette, shall annually hereafter, at the places where they usually meet for the election of township officers, on the day appointed by law, for the election of constables in the different townships in this commonwealth, elect respectively four suitable persons, inhabitants of the townships aforesaid, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, two of whom shall be appointed constables for the township of Washington, and two for the township of Dunbar, in the same manner, with like powers and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties, as are provided and contained in the several laws concerning constables within this commonwealth.*
